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Introduction

In January 2012, Mayor Roger Brossmer convened a priority-setting session for the Downey City Council. It was critical to articulate and focus the City Council members' overarching goals for the city in light of ongoing economic challenges and the recent devastating cuts in funding due to State and Federal government activities.

This is the strategic planning document developed by City Staff to implement the Council's priorities. Each priority is accompanied by an objective and a plan for addressing the

priority. Also included are specific projects, policies, programs and services which comprise the work plan for the City's departments and divisions in executing the City Council's 2012 Strategic Priorities.

The document also serves as the accountability template for measuring the progress of implementation of the Council's priorities. A bimonthly report from the City Manager to Council will detail the incremental progress and Priorities Report will be issued in January 2013 to outline the accomplishments, initiatives and next steps.

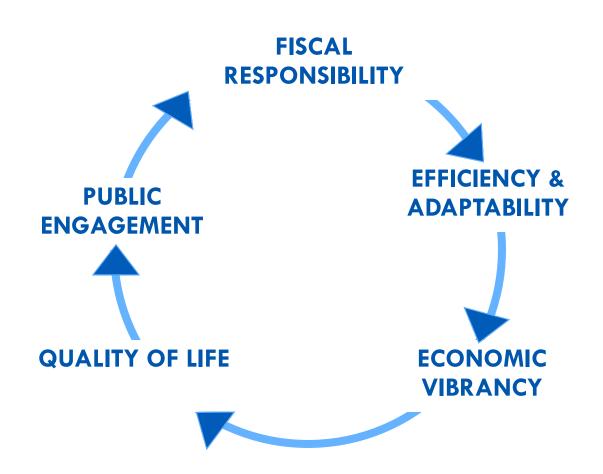
Mission

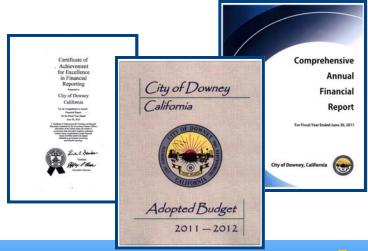
Priority: FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY

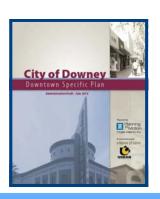

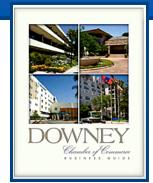

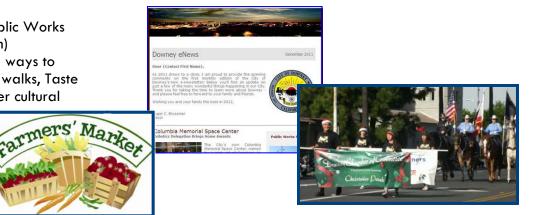
